

Minab Elementary School Children Memorial: “Bloodbath in School: Minab City in Mourning for Victims of American Missiles”

A memorial ceremony for the victims of the inhumane attack by the United States on a school in the city of Minab was held on Friday, April 3, 2026 (14 Farvardin 1405) in the city of Vienna. The event, titled “Silent Memorial for the Child Victims of Minab School,” took place from 10:00 AM to 4:30 PM next to Christian-Broda Square, at the beginning of Mariahilfer Straße, one of the tourist streets in the heart of Vienna.

In this gathering, a group of Iranians residing in Austria, along with a number of citizens interested in peace and human rights, participated. Through silence and paying tribute, they honored the memory of the innocent schoolchildren who had been martyred in this incident. The organizers, emphasizing the human and apolitical nature of this assembly, stated that their goal was to keep the memory of the victims alive and to draw public attention to the consequences of violence and war.

Several Austrian citizens also attended the ceremony. While viewing the displayed images and listening to music pieces produced under the two themes “Massacre of Innocent Children of Minab Elementary School” and “Music of Peace,” they expressed sympathy with the people of Iran. They condemned the brutal killing of 168 schoolchildren in Minab by the US Army and expressed hope that, with the end of war and warmongering, not only Iran but the entire world would witness lasting peace and tranquility.

During the ceremony, symbols such as students’ backpacks and dolls, along with an image of a blood-stained backpack bearing the number “168” as a memorial to the number of victims, were displayed. Participants created a sorrowful atmosphere by holding candles and observing silence. The hashtag “#AngelsOfMinab” was also used as a symbol of empathy and solidarity with the grieving families.

Additionally, the organizers of this street memorial distributed flyers in German explaining the tragedy among visitors to the photo exhibition.

This ceremony was organized in collaboration with the “Iranians Wisdom House” in Vienna and with the participation of a group of cultural and social activists. At the end, the participants emphasized the necessity of upholding human dignity, supporting children, and working to prevent the repetition of such atrocities.
